

Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Alarm (England) Regulations 2015, No. 1693

The Law ?

New Smoke and Carbon Monoxide regulations require residential landlords in England to have working and regularly tested smoke and CO alarms in all residential properties. The new legislation came in to force on 1st October 2015 and is expected to help prevent up to 26 deaths and as many as 670 injuries a year. Changes for landlords

Landlords in England are now legally required to have working and regularly tested smoke and CO alarms in all residential properties. The CO alarms must be sensor inclusively tested at the start of all new tenancies and during regular property inspections.

The Penalties?

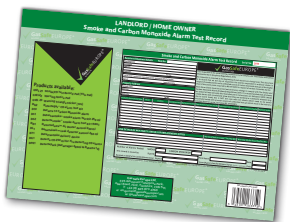
Landlords not abiding by the regulations face prosecution and fines of up to £5,000 per property.
